May's Speaker is Tony Silva of Silva Orchids

Tony Silva will be speaking this month about the history of the orchid business and its future. He is a second generation orchid grower who, along with his brother Joe, operates Silva Orchids in Neptune, N.J. The brothers sell premium quality flowering orchids and other orchid specimens to the high end flower shops in New York City. Their greenhouses are open to the public on Fridays and Saturdays. They also have an online catalog.

Silva Orchids was founded in 1957 by August Silva. "Gus" started growing orchids in 1934 and became known for his superb orchid culture. In 1977 his sons, Anthony and Joseph took over the

business after Gus' passing and have continued the tradition of producing only quality orchids.


The company has received over 75 AOS awards and they were the winner of the 2006 Ernest Hetherington Award for the best plant grown in the country for that same year and the Robert Dugger Award for the best *Odontoglossum* grown in 2005.

Silva Orchids is the home of the Shore Orchid Festival held annually in June. The festival boasts 20 vendors from around the world with AOS Judging, free lecture and workshops. For more information visit the web site at silvaorchids.com
